

Concussion prevention & ATV safety

ATV Safety

CSL revised the IWK ATV Position Statement and Backgrounder document to represent new ATV safety research and best practices.

As the co-chair of the national ATV Safety Working Group, CSL collaborated with national partners to develop a document that outlines ATV legislation and enforcement across Canada.

CSL developed new concussion content for social media and participated in an interview on CTV. CSL, in collaboration with a health promotion student intern, also conducted a survey regarding parents', and caregivers' knowledge of childhood concussion.

Safety at School

Active Transportation & School-based injury prevention

CSL is developing plans for our work in school injury prevention. This year, CSL developed several new partnerships (e.g., Walk'n Roll Halifax) and participated in Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) Active School Travel engagement sessions. CSL also participated in Province of Nova Scotia's engagement session for a new Active Transportation Strategy.

To increase awareness of the program and CSL materials, CSL also submitted two articles to the Halifax Regional Centre for Education Health Promotion Newsletter.


CSL conducted a significant literature review of each CSL priority topic area in the context of a school setting. Several reviews and recommendations were drafted specifically on poisoning prevention and concussion prevention.

Child Passenger Safety

CSL answers inquiries from both families and service providers (e.g., nurses, Family Resource Centre staff, etc.) and provides consultation services (e.g. policy development) to organizations across Atlantic Canada.



Transporting Children with Special Healthcare Needs

Katherine Hutka, Health Promotion Specialist, provided both in person and virtual consultations to support the safe transportation of children with special healthcare needs.

Service to understand the needs of Unattached Newborns (newborns without family physicians)

CSL staff were present at each Unattached Newborn Clinic held in Halifax on January 28, 29 and March 25, 2023. The purpose was to educate and support families with their car seats, and to gather information to evaluate current IWK/NSH policy and education.

Of the families who attended, 74% had at least one parent who was born outside of Canada or identified as a newcomer. Most families seen at the clinic had a safe and appropriate infant seat, however;

- 48% needed their harness tightened.
- 44% of families needed to be reminded that the chest clip should be placed at armpit level.
- 43% of car seats were installed too loose and needed tightening.
- 70% of seats were installed with a improper installation angle.

Child Passenger Safety



With generous funding from the Insurance Bureau of Canada, CSL established an Atlantic-wide car seat grant program.

Promotion of the grant started in fiscal 2022-2023 and will be implemented in 2023-2024. CSL will distribute up to 45 grants of \$1000 to eligible Family Resource Centers and First Nation & Inuit Health Centres across Atlantic Canada. These grants can be used to purchase car seats and/or booster seats for centers to distribute to families who may not otherwise have access to a safe car seat.

The grant program was promoted to 118 centres across Atlantic Canada + First Nations and Inuit Health Centres.

NS Car Seat Grant Program

In 2021-2022, CSL implemented a car seat grant program in Nova Scotia and reports were completed in fiscal 21-22.

Katherine Hutka, CSL is the President of CPSAC. In her role, she has collaborated and supported many national projects including:


- contributing to the complete revision of the CPSAC technician evaluation process including a re-written curriculum, instructor manual, guizzes (to replace the exam) and other assessments.

On Nov 20, 2022: International Day of the Child, CSL launched a new Community of Practice (CoP) called *The Link*.


The Link is an online community for professionals, colleagues, and like-minded individuals linking us and the work we do in children's injury prevention.


