


THE RISKS OF TOPPLING FURNITURE AND TVs

2-4 years old




5-9 years old




10-14 years old

How can we prevent toppling injuries?



Teach your children not to climb on dressers




Attach heavy furniture to the wall using anchors or safety straps



Do not put heavy TVs on top of dressers



Do not place items that kids want up on high shelves



Open only 1 drawer at a time. Put heavy items in bottom drawers.
