
Child Safety Link Annual Report 2021 - 2022

POISONING PREVENTION, FALL PREVENTION, & HOME SAFETY

Poisoning Prevention Week (PPW)

PPW 21-22 was celebrated in March 2022 with the theme "Lock it, Label it, Store it!" CSL collaborated with the IWK Regional Poison Centre on a social media campaign with a Myth vs Reality theme. They also presented during Parachute's National Poisoning Prevention Webinar Series on the topic of illegal cannabis products, packages, and sellers.

CSL received a grant from Parachute to distribute locking bags and cabinets locks to 25 Family Resource Centres across Atlantic Canada. This was a follow-up from a resource mailout in June 2021.



Atlantic Working Group on Children's Fall Prevention

CSL is taking a lead role as Chair of this newly formed group of partners from Across Atlantic Canada. The working group currently includes members from Injury Free Nova Scotia, Atlantic Collaborative on Injury Prevention, NB Trauma, PEI Department of Health & Wellness, and Nova Scotia Health.

Safe Housing and Injury Prevention

Chantal Walsh (CSL) and others from IWK Health including Mental Health and Addictions, presented at IWK Health Grand Rounds (Sept. 2021) – Health & Housing panel. The discussion included topics such as the importance of safe, affordable housing and how that related to injury and injury prevention.

CONCUSSION PREVENTION & ATV SAFETY

Concussion Prevention

CSL developed new concussion content for social media and participated in an interview on CTV. CSL, in collaboration with a health promotion student intern, also conducted a survey regarding parents and caregivers knowledge of childhood concussion. The data collected from this survey will be used to inform future concussion work.

ATV Safety

CSL revised the IWK ATV Position Statement to better represent new ATV safety research and best practices.

As a member of the ATV Safety Working Group, CSL collaborated with the Atlantic Collaborative on Injury Prevention and other national partners to develop a document that outlines ATV legislation and enforcement across Canada.





CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY

The Right Seat Video Project

CSL developed new resources to support child passenger safety education for families in multiple languages and for families who experience low literacy.

Resources include:

- Videos: A short, educational video with images of local families.
- Print resources: Each print resource covers the same points as the video and have English on one side and each additional language on the other side. The print resource is intended to support an English speaker assisting a caregiver in the other language.
- How to Guide: A guide to support the use of videos and print resources (E/F).
- Posters: Poster in English/French for newcomer populations; Poster in English/French for First Nations Centres

In total, 130 packages, in 9 languages, were distributed to Family Resource Centres and newcomer organizations across Atlantic Canada. An additional 42 packages of English, French and Mi'kmaq resources were distributed to First Nations Health Centres and Friendship Centres across Atlantic Canada.

The Right Seat Video languages

English, French, Mi'kmaq, Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, Nepalese, Swahili, Somali and Tigrinya.

The Right Seat Resource Evaluation

Following the launch of the resources, CSL distributed a follow-up survey, to determine if the resources were useful. We wanted to know if these resources changed how often professionals provided car seat information to families who may experience low literacy and/or speak English as an additional language, and we wanted to seek feedback on the resources.

- All respondents who used the resources indicated that the video resources were accessible and easy to follow,
- The majority responded that the families in the videos reflected the families they serve and that the print resource were accessible and easy to follow.
- The majority of respondents (76.9%) indicated that the resources would increase how often they provide car seat information to families.

Video Views

We received 1462 views with the top viewed languages being English (55%), Mi'kmaq (15%). and French (10%)

Child Passenger Safety Week (CPSW) Theme: "The Right Seat for Every Child"

CSL promoted the Right Seat Resource videos for CPSW celebrated the third week of September.

Media: CSL conducted multiple interviews including: Global TV; CTV (re: Mi'kmaq resources); Halifax Today; Country 94.1 (Saint John NB).

Inquires

CSL answers inquires from both families and professionals (e.g. police, Family Resource Centre staff, nurses) and provides consultation services (e.g. policy development) to organizations across Atlantic Canada.

CSL received 1022 CPS inquiries /consultation requests

- 27% by phone
- 40% by email
- 33% through Facebook

STAC: Safe Travel for All Children consultations

Katherine Hutka provided both in person and virtual consultations to support the safe transportation of children with special needs.



CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY & ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION

Car Seat Grant Program

CSL implemented a car seat grant program in Nova Scotia awarding 13 grants (\$1,000 each) to Family Resource Centres throughout the province. Reports will be available in fiscal year 22-23.

Active Transportation (AT)

CSL supports school AT development projects as part of Parachute's Elementary Road Safety grant program. CSL is involved with several schools in the program and supported a SWOT analysis with a traffic audit. Most school projects had delayed starts due to COVID.

CSL developed three backgrounders relating to safety on the road:

- Child Passenger Safety in Taxis
- Safe Travel in Alternative Modes of Transportation
- Active Transportation Safety






