

Re: Booster Seat Lesson Plan

Dear Principal,

The IWK's injury prevention program, Child Safety Link, is excited to promote child passenger safety throughout Nova Scotia in celebration of Child Passenger Safety Week 2017. We are reaching out to schools to highlight the Booster Seat Lesson Plan, which is approved by the Nova Scotia Department of Education and Early Childhood Development and is available on the Nova Scotia teacher's website.

Injuries related to motor vehicle collisions are the leading cause of injury-related death for Canadian children. Children are at higher risk for injuries when they are not buckled into the correct seat. Current evidence suggests that booster seats provide up to 60% more protection than seat belts alone. In a 2012 Nova Scotia roadside study, 52% of children observed were using the adult seat belt without a booster seat before they were safe or legal to do so.

The Booster Seat Lesson Plan is an evidence-based intervention and is well received by children and schools. This 20 minute program is part of the Nova Scotia curriculum for Grade 2 and can positively influence booster seat use for this age group.
